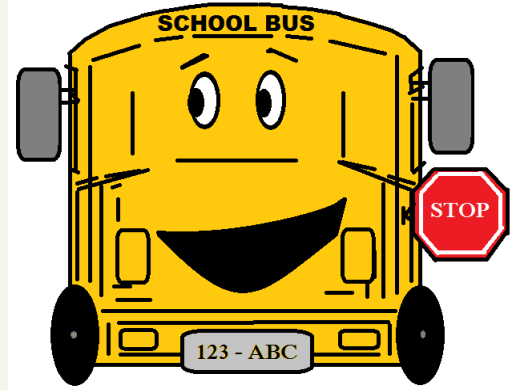
forms will ask for you to provide more information than we are legally required to provide. For more info, go to www.mache.org/legal/ or feel free to contact us with any questions!

Homeschooling: Does it really matter? Is it really worth it? Those are the two common questions Home Educators face. We've all heard the excuses: "My students might be too sheltered"..."I don't know where or how to

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But is that *really* the case?

That is the question that must be addressed.

To start with, we must realize that, yes, it is true that homeschooling *does* require effort. It takes time, energy, space to some extent, resources, as well as the knowledge of how

to handle various situations and requirements. On the other hand, however, other options of schooling require sacrifices as well, just in different ways.

Really, what it all comes down to, is how we use our time. Do we have our priorities in order? Are we making the most out of each moment God has blessed us with?

Do we use our limited amount of time and resources to accomplish things that are really worthwhile?

God's Word reminds us of the brevity of our lives, comparing our lives to a vapor that appears for a little while (James 4:14) & a flower of the field that flourishes for a time, and then fades away (Psalm 103:15).

Knowing that our time here on earth is limited; that our days are numbered (Psalm 39:4-5; 139:16) certainly makes us think about our lives, & how we use them. With that in mind, it should spur us on to best managing our limited amount of time in this short life that God has blessed us with, so we can accomplish the many responsibilities that God has given us — those of highest value, utmost

importance, & worth our time.

The things that Home Educating may initially take away from you—things like your own time and energy—you receive back in even greater, more worthwhile blessings—blessings that are far more lasting than those things you initially "gave up". To be able to walk alongside your children as they grow, to watch them learn, to cherish those little moments rather than taking them for granted, to teach them truths from Scripture, the privilege of spending more of that fleeting, precious, God-given time with your family, the ability to pursue those things we hold so dear: Faith, Family, & Freedom. 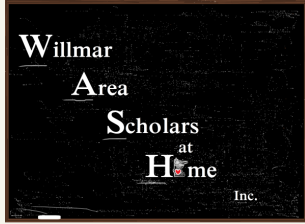
